Ofsted Inspection Update - 2026

Our second full Ofsted inspection took place over three days, from 19th to 21st May, and we are delighted that it went extremely well.

The new inspection framework is far more thorough and detailed than previous approaches. Rather than focusing on a single overall judgement, inspectors now review schools across seven common inspection areas, with additional consideration given to nursery and sixth form provision where applicable. Each area is carefully evaluated, with a detailed description provided alongside the grades awarded.

In addition, unlike publicly funded schools, Edullect Academy is also required to meet the Independent School Standards. This is in itself a very rigorous process, requiring schools to demonstrate consistently high standards across all aspects of their provision, including the quality and suitability of the school premises and resources.

We are extremely pleased with the inspection outcome, as it reflects the quality, ambition and high standards we have established so early in the school's journey. While the official report has not yet been published, we will share it with our community as soon as it becomes public.

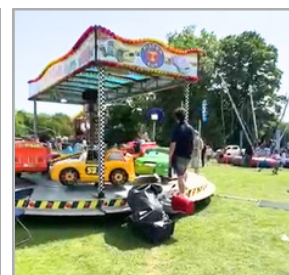
Eid Fest in Havering Park
